Types of Gifts

A Specific Gift: This type of gift enables you to leave a specific cash amount, asset, shares, property or other investments.

Whole of your estate

A Percentage Gift: This can be any percentage of your total estate enabling you to share your estate among several people or organisations without specifying the property or amounts.

A Residual Gift: A residuary bequest is a portion or the remainder of your estate after all other available gifts and other financial commitments have been honoured.
