"Something that's just for me"

When Ruth heard about Choices, she decided to see if we could help her and reached out to Choices for reflexology and head massages. Ruth, who has melanoma and secondary lung cancer, says the treatments have allowed her to momentarily forget about therapies and the pressures of her diagnosis, and take her mind into a different space.

"I feel so much better because the treatments are just for me. The staff have been so lovely, and the care provided to me has been priceless. I look forward to going to Choices because it's not like going to chemotherapy and radiation, it's something just totally relaxing."

Through Choices, cancer patients like Ruth and their families can access a range of services and programs. Our specialist men's and women's health nurses, physiotherapists, and complementary therapists will:

- Advise about surgery and treatments
- Connect breast care nurses, women's health nurses and peer support workers
- Coordinate support groups
- Advise on broader topics including stress management, sexuality, fertility, survivorship, menopause, exercise and nutrition
- Provide a range of additional support services including rural and regional workshops, and give community education presentations to schools, clubs and businesses.

People who have had cancer in the past also take part in the program. They may still require the strength and support of our professional team, or belong to a Support Group that assists other people.

Choices is free of charge to everyone who has cancer, regardless of where they live. But we can only continue to provide these services with the support of the community, and the generosity of people who leave a bequest to The Wesley in their Will.





Keely's brave fight for life

When Keely was 13, her mother Cathy was told that her daughter had one of two types of rare brain cancer. But without a firm diagnosis there was no hope of successful treatment and recovery. Knowing of the innovative and advanced care that The Wesley provides, Cathy reached out to us.

"What drew me to The Wesley was their pride in offering the 'gold standard' of cancer care and treatment. I knew as soon as I met this team that this was the place Keely needed to be.

The place that could save her life."

Thanks to generous donations and bequests, The Wesley has been able to provide the complex treatment and care that Keely needs. "Keely's medical team is incredible. The care, commitment and expertise we've experienced here has literally kept Keely alive."

Keely has fought a brave fight, however a routine scan in 2018 revealed that the tumour and a cyst on her pineal gland were growing.

"The Wesley team took urgent action and advised that Keely needed two more surgeries and radiation therapy to try and shrink the tumours. It was heartbreaking news, as Keely had said she would never have brain surgery again, but it's going to save her life. She also had a biopsy on the pineal gland area that finally revealed the diagnosis we needed – Keely's cancer is germinoma and with radiation therapy, we have a chance."
